**Subject:-** Scheme for Development of Gaushala and Gosadans for the year 2020-21 (N).

**Memo**

This scheme is being proposed to be implemented in the State during the financial year 2020-21. In this scheme Rs. 20 Crore has been allotted by the Government and District Deputy Directors, Animal Husbandry-cum-District Gauvansh Development Officers have been declared as Drawing and Disbursing Officer for this Scheme by Finance Department (copy enclosed).

#### **Brief Background**

The Haryana Government notified "The Haryana Gauvansh Sanrakshan and Gausamvardhan Act, 2015" (Haryana Act No. 20 of 2015) vide Gazette (Extraordinary) Notification No. Leg. 27/2015 dated 19.11.2015. In this Act strict provisions have been made for prevention of cow slaughter in the State. In addition, provisions have also been made for development of indigenous breeds of cows.

In Section 10 of the Act, a provision has been made for "establishment of institution" an extract of which is reproduced as under-

10. (1) The Government, or a local authority when so directed by the Government, shall establish an institution to accept, keep, maintain and care the infirm, injured, stray and uneconomic cows.
- (2) The Government shall provide adequate financial and technical support to such institution.

#### **Justification of the Scheme**

As per 2019 livestock census, the State has livestock population of 71.26 lakhs of which 19.32 lakhs are cattle. Of these cattle, population 9.51 lakhs are indigenous cattle and 9.81 lakhs are exotic/cross bred cattle. In view of diminishing role of the male cattle in agricultural operations because of extensive mechanization,

males continue to form a sizeable proportion of the cattle population. Out of total cattle population of 9.51 lakhs of indigenous cattle and 9.81 lakhs of exotic/cross bred cattle, the males are 2.52 lakhs (26.49%) and 0.98 lakhs (10.01%), respectively. The high proportion of males and unproductive cows results into problem of stray cattle. Due to economic reasons, farmers let their animals loose when these become unproductive which results in the problem of stray animals.

As per the latest survey report by the Deputy Directors approximately 4.48 lakh stray animals are housed in the 627 Gaushalas of the State. However approximately 55,498 stray animals, of which 35,104 are males and 20,394 are females, are wandering as stray. These stray animals in rural areas cause damage to the crops and in urban areas result in accidents and related problems for road traffic and pose serious threat of physical harm to public. There has arisen an emergent situation requiring rehabilitation of these stray animals in Gaushalas and making provision for their feed and shelter. To eliminate the menace of stray cattle in general and also for their welfare, these animals are to be rehabilitated in the Gaushalas. The Gaushalas accommodating these stray cattle need to be suitably assisted financially.

#### **Objectives of the Scheme**

The main objectives of the Scheme are as follows-

1. Rehabilitation and general welfare of uneconomic, weak, infirm, debilitated stray cattle
2. To prevent loss of agricultural crops by stray cattle
3. To minimize threat of physical harm posed to general public by these cattle.
4. To prevent road accidents and avoiding loss of lives and property.
5. To prevent untimely death of these cattle due to ingestion of polythene and other municipal garbage.
6. Identification of these cattle by tagging them with 12 digits unique Ear Tags.
7. Encouraging Gaushalas by providing financial assistance to them for rehabilitation of stray cattle.

#### **Expected outcomes of the Scheme**

The expected outcomes of the Scheme are as follows-

1. The mitigation of stray cattle menace.
2. Avoidance and minimization of road accidents happening because of stray cattle.
3. General welfare of cattle as the infirm, uneconomic, weak and debilitated cattle shall get appropriate shelter and feed.
4. Avoidance of agricultural crop loss.
5. Identification of all cattle in the State by Ear Tagging.
6. Holistic development of Gaushalas in the State.

### Financial assistance under the Scheme

The financial assistance in form of Grant-in-Aid will be provided to Gaushalas and Nandishalas to encourage them for rehabilitation of stray. The mechanism of providing such Grant-in-Aid will be based on the percentage of non-productive animals housed in these Gaushala, the details of which are as follows-

Sr. No.	Percentage of non-productive animals in Gaushala	Financial assistance for fodder per animal per annum*
1.	100 %	Rs. 400/-
2.	99-76 %	Rs. 300/-
3.	75-51 %	Rs. 200/-
4.	50-33 %	Rs. 100/-
5.	Less than 33%	Nil

\* A Nandishala housing 100 % Nandi (male cattle) will receive financial assistance for fodder at the rate of Rs. 500/- per animal per annum

### Eligibility conditions for the Applicant Gaushala

A Gaushala/Nandishala will have to fulfill following conditions to become eligible for financial assistance-

1. The Gaushala must be situated in State of Haryana
2. The Gaushala should be registered under 'The Haryana Registration and Regulation of Societies Act, 2012' by Registrar, Firms and Societies.
3. Any Gaushala willing to take financial assistance shall have to be registered with Animal Husbandry & Dairying Department, Haryana. The format for applying for registration is enclosed as **Annexure-III**.
4. The Gaushala will abide by all the directions issued by Animal Husbandry and Dairying Department Haryana from time to time regarding breeding, vaccination, management practices etc.

### Process of submission of application by the Gaushalas

Any Gaushala, which is eligible as per the aforementioned criteria can apply to District Deputy Directors, Animal Husbandry and Dairying Department-cum-District Gauvansh Development Officer in the prescribed format to get assistance under the scheme for the maintenance of rehabilitated stray cattle. For applying for financial assistance following documents would be required-

- i. Application for Grant-in Aid duly filled in prescribed format as enclosed at Annexure-I.
- ii. Self attested copy of registration certificate of Gaushala issued by Registrar, Firms and Societies.



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- iii. Self attested copy of registration certificate of Gaushala with Animal Husbandry & Dairying Department, Haryana.
  - iv. Audited Balance sheet of Gaushala for last financial year.
  - v. Bank Accounts Details of Gaushala.
  - vi. Self Declaration/Undertaking as enclosed at Annexure-II.
  - vii. Any other document as may be required to disburse the financial assistance.

#### **Financial Roll out of the Scheme**

There is 19.32 lakh cattle population in the State. The farmers/dairy owners let their cattle loose when these animals become unproductive. Also farmers are not willing to keep male cattle as these animals being devoid of any economic importance. This is a continuous process of cattle becoming ownerless and stray therefore their rehabilitation is a continuous process.

The budget under the Scheme would be utilized quarter wise. The sequence of release of Grant-in-Aid to Gaushalas will be in such a manner that those Gaushalas to whom Grant-in-Aids are released in the first two quarters of a financial year will be provided Grant-in-Aids in the same period i.e. first two quarters of the next financial year. The process of release of Grant-in-Aids will be similar in the case of third and fourth quarters.

#### **Process for release of the Grant in Aid**

1. The Gaushala seeking Grant-in-Aid shall apply to Deputy Director, Animal Husbandry & Dairying of the concerned district in prescribed format as enclosed at Annexure-I and Annexure-II alongwith all requisite documents through area Veterinary Surgeon.
2. The Veterinary Surgeon will assess and enumerate the percentage of non-productive animals in the Gaushala and forward the application to Sub Divisional Officer (Animal Husbandry & Dairying) of concerned Sub Division.
3. The Sub Divisional Officer (Animal Husbandry & Dairying) will visit the Gaushala for physical verification, certify the percentage of non-productive animals in the Gaushala and submit it to Deputy Director, Animal Husbandry & Dairying with recommendations.
4. On the basis of the recommendations submitted by the Sub Divisional Officer (Animal Husbandry & Dairying), the Deputy Director will forward a copy of application along with recommendations to the Director General, Animal Husbandry & Dairying, Haryana for approval of Grant-in-Aid.

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5. The application will be scrutinized and processed by Gaushala Development Officer and if found in order the approval will be conveyed to the concerned Deputy Director.
  6. The concerned Deputy Director will release the Grant-in-Aid in Bank account of Gaushala.

In the light of the aforementioned proposal Government is requested to accord administrative-cum-financial approval for Rs. 2000.00 lac to implement this scheme. The expenditure involved shall be debited to the budget grant on following head:-
